## A Message from Pastor Hyejung Hwang

Since I started CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) in Merrill, and working at my local site, which is St. Michael's Hospital, I have met many people, including family of patients and staff. My intention of visiting is to help people feel better about their lives through the assistance with the spirituality side. I learn about people's needs in their time of feeling vulnerable and I develop the pastoral care that I can offer.

As I talk with people who are in different seasons of life, I see clearly that our life always has light and darkness. As autumn has equal length between day and night, it might be a good time to recognize our darkness as well as light within us. I read a quote of how we can accept our darkness by Joyce Rupp, Catholic writer and poet. *"I gratefully acknowledge how darkness has become less of an enemy for me and more of a place of silent nurturance, where the slow, steady gestation needed for my soul's growth can occur. Not only is light a welcomed part of my life, but I am also developing a greater understanding of how much I need to befriend my inner darkness."*

As the leaves change their colors and fall down to bring new life, it reminds us that we also are being transformed by God's grace to bring hope and we are called to change and grow. It is more than just the cycling of a year, when we recognize that we are in God's plan, who is caring for us even in this moment. Reflecting on this season when trees are losing their leaves of beautiful colors, I feel God's presence, and I am thankful for God's plan to bring new life as well as giving thanks to God for this year's harvest. I believe that God's presence gives us hope whatever the season of our life is. Invite God to be with you in the season of your life. God is waiting to enrich us and give us strength.

### A Change of Seasons, A Season of Change

Autumn in Wisconsin is a beautiful and wonderful season. The air is crisp and clear, the trees burst forth in color, the days begin to shorten towards earlier darkness and we begin thinking toward the upcoming fall and winter holidays. We won't go into the snow at this point; for now, we just enjoy the lovely autumn.

Seasons are a good and powerful reminder to us that change is a normal, natural and positive part of life. Through change, the creation renews itself and generates life and vitality. We know that for each ending there is a new beginning, and that things will not stay stuck for long.
