### From Pastor Hyejung

One of the new things I have learned about this culture is the idea of the Easter Bunny and Easter Egg Hunt. I of course had painted eggs and created baskets every year on Easter Sunday in my childhood. Since I had worked as a teacher and a director for Children's ministry, boiling eggs was the main activity that I was involved in for Easter Sunday. I remember decorating eggs to share with both friends and strangers. Doing something with eggs has always been associated with Easter. And, I saw people think of spring, once bunnies and eggs show up. For some it may mean that spring is coming or maybe a chance for change; out with the old, in with the new. For some, it means candies, special meals, and gardening or something else to get ready for spring. For Christians, the meaning is not very different, since Easter is a time of renewal. It may be relatively easy to renew things outwardly like new clothes and gardening, but renewal on the inside can be more difficult. Problems from the past can stay stuck in one's memory. Sometimes loneliness, anger, hurt and pain still irritate inside.

Where do we find inner renewal? Friends, family, counselors or books can be helpful. But for Christians, the real inner renewal comes from Jesus. We are forgiven, we became God's loved one, we have been transformed to match God's own image. Then we are called to be a partner for God's work.

Sometimes we have been stuck in a broken relationship, patterns that have made us scared of life's challenges and insensitive of the injustice in the world. But Easter reminds us of the light of hope God gave us.

As we enjoy eggs and bunnies this spring, what might be a message that reminds us of the experience of renewal? How can we think of renewal better and more deeply than simply eggs? I hope this Easter can be a chance to find ways to connect to God and to give God all that we are.

**SEND A BARREL OF SCHOOL SUPPLIES TO THE SCHOOLS IN AWOROWA, GHANA**

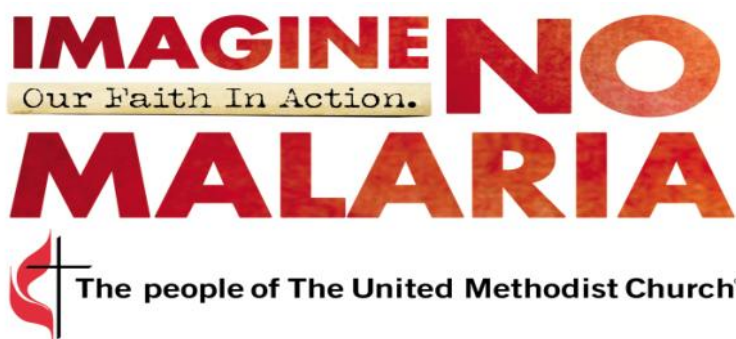

## Changing the world, one life at a time

### **Interfaith Food Pantry of Portage County** 2820 Post Rd, Plover



Are you willing to be a servant with the Interfaith Food Pantry who could be on call? Sometimes a person who has volunteered to help at the pantry finds they cannot assist and they need someone to fill in. Please call the church office (715-344-3557 or 715-344-9192) to volunteer.

The Interfaith Food Pantry is a full pantry program, serving all individuals and families in need in Portage County. The pantry is open the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of each month from 6:00 - 8:00 pm. The only requirement to receive food is to show proof of residency in Portage County. Recipients are eligible to come both times each month. Donations may be dropped off at the church or at the pantry by calling Mel Dow at 715-347-2689.

**On March 10, 2015** Interfaith Food Pantry served 151 families, of which 18 were newly registered families. In those families were 603 individuals, 217 children (16 and under) and 65 seniors (65+).

**On March 24, 2015** 160 families were served, 20 of them new. In those families were 639 individuals (89 new), 240 children (46 new) and 58 seniors (1 new).

### **Out in the Community. . .**

The Men's Group serves a meal the first Thursday of each month at the Hope Center. The group meets at 3:30 @ the Point location to prepare the meal, which is then served at 5:30 pm.

Adult Ministry - Place of Peace team serves a meal on the third Thursday of each month at Place of Peace (housed in The First Baptist Church). Those preparing the meal arrive at 3:30 pm, those serving the meal arrive just before 5:00 pm. Clean-up is approximately 5:30 - 6:00 pm.

The youth serve a meal on the fourth Friday of each month. They are asked to arrive at the Hope Center at 4:15 pm to help prepare and serve dinner. They are done by 5:45 pm.

**Meals on Wheels of Stevens Point is in need of volunteer drivers.** Meals are delivered Monday-Friday between 11:00am-12:00pm and each route can take anywhere from 30-60 minutes—depending on the number of recipients. We especially need help driving routes on Monday and Thursday. If you don't want to commit to delivering a route each week, consider delivering twice a month or being a substitute driver. If you or someone you know would be able to spare one hour, this could be a great opportunity for you to give back and volunteer. ## Stewardship Corner

### APRIL 2015 A STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE FOR YOUR CHURCH

**#15-4 Give Willingly...** "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God". (Matt. 22:21)

**Did you know?** The average tax refund is up 3% to \$3,034 so far this year, the Internal Revenue Service reported on March 5. The average tax refund for the last three years, paid in 2012, 2013 and 2014 was just over \$2,700.

How will we spend our tax refunds? We know that some taxpayers do not receive a refund. However, of those who do, how do they spend it? The most popular answers are: 1) Pay off Debt, 2) Have fun - do something special or buy something special and 3) Save it. On most lists of ideas the thought of 4) Giving it Away to a favorite charity is either last on the list or never makes the list!

If we are going to "give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God", what are we called to give away? As people of faith, we may wish to consider giving a tithe (10%) or some portion of our tax return to the church to say thank you to God for the jobs we have and the earnings we receive.

Consider tithing. If the average refund is \$2,700 and 10 people tithe at \$270 each, the total giving to your church would increase \$2,700. That might pay most of the snowplowing bill for the winter or help you do something new and creative for Vacation Bible School.

Your tithe might be more or less than average, but a gift of \$270 would save 27 lives at \$10 apiece for the Imagine No Malaria Campaign. Gifts totaling \$2,700 would also make a big difference in paying the mission giving through our apportionments for a number of churches - for some it would pay their apportionments in full, for others it will cover 1/10 of the total or one month.

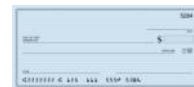

## Youth Ministry

### **Social Justice and Fundraising--How Youth Do It**

From Advent to Lent, Stevens Point Youth Community (SYC) events and missions raised in excess of \$3,000 for clean water access, hunger and poverty prevention, and malaria treatment and prevention.

SYC, a joint youth ministry from the United Methodist and Episcopal churches of the Stevens Point and Plover area, began the Church Year with *Advent Conspiracy*, rethinking Christmas, learning of the need for, and impact of, clean water in our world. Youth saved money and donated close to \$300 for *Living Water International--Zimbabwe Project*.

As Lent began, our Youth and others from Central WI and the Fox Valley area, joined in a *30-Hour Famine* hosted by St. Anne's Episcopal church in De Pere. During this lock-in, 40 Youth and Leaders fasted, worked on local mission projects, shared in community building challenges, fellowship, worship and prayer. Around \$2,500 was raised for *World Vision* and our local *Interfaith Food Pantry*.

Last Sunday, SYC hosted a Dance-A-Thon for *Imagine No Malaria*. Youth danced for an hour straight, had a great time, and through event pledges raised over \$200 for *Imagine No Malaria*.

Through these programs and events, Youth learn, raise awareness, advocate for change, build community, change lives as the hands and feet of Jesus.
