## From Retired Pastor Bob Linaberry-Charis

I have never been a very good imitator of John Wesley, founder of Methodism. Word has it he was up every morning before the sun to get down on his knees for prayer and devotion and Bible study. As a result, it is said, John Wesley had “camel’s knees” ... calloused like knees of a camel from constant use. Well, I don’t wear shorts as much as our fearless leader HJH, but the occasional good look at my knees tells you I don’t spend John Wesley kind of time on my knees for prayer or meditation. I need help in that department ... always have, always will. To provide at least some daily meditative thoughts, I have subscribed to a daily E-Mail to help me have at least a minute with God every day. It’s been helpful ... maybe you’d like to try it - <http://www.godsminute.org>. I’m not saying it fits my particular theological bent every day, but most days it gets me into scripture and into thinking, which you may remember covers two of the pillars of the Wesleyan Quadrilateral of doing theology ... you can Google that.

As I prepared to write this article for the May newsletter this morning, I opened my “God’s Minute” message and this is what I saw: HE WILL COMMAND HIS ANGELS CONCERNING YOU TO GUARD YOU IN ALL YOUR WAYS. (PSALM 91:10 \*NIV). Scripture is replete with references of angels and their actions in peoples’ lives, many of which indicate a “guardian” nature. Here’s another one: THEY WILL LIFT YOU UP IN THEIR HANDS, SO THAT YOU WILL NOT STRIKE YOUR FOOT AGAINST A STONE. (PSALM 91:12). They not only are there ... they are active in our lives according to scripture.

OK, we hear about “Guardian Angels” a lot, don’t we? But I’m guessing we haven’t thought about them much. I certainly can’t recall actually having seen one like some people have reported ... but you can be darn sure I have needed a few, given my propensity to foolish, human foibles and the need to be bailed out. And according to scripture they are there “in all our ways” ... which means, I’ve received them when I’ve needed them.

WHEW ... I needed to hear that. Once again today, I get a word of God’s expression of grace in my life. Life is not a particularly easy venture at times ... but to know “God has my back” is an extraordinary experience of life. Hey, there’s the third pillar of Wesley’s Quadrilateral!

The tradition of the Christian movement (... and there’s number four for WQ) is that God’s love never ends ... no matter what. We need to hear that more often than we do. Without any condition, God loves us and offers his spiritual protection ... many times through “Guardian Angels”, seen and unseen.

And, yes, grandmas out there ... God’s love is even bigger than a grandma’s love. I think that gets an amen, don’t you?? AMEN!!! And, AMEN!!!

... and just for the heck of it, when you get a chance, check out HJH’s knees.

### The Master Gardner

Last weekend after church, I announced to the kids that we were going home to do yard work. This statement was met with a collective moan from my children. “It won’t be bad” I explained, “we just have to rake out the flower beds, and pick up all the sticks in the yard, and put out our patio furniture”. “Why do we have to do all that stuff?” they whined. I explained to them that when we pick up all the sticks and debris from the yard, it allows the grass to get more sunlight and grow better. Likewise, when we rake all the “stuff” from the flower beds, it gets the soil ready for watering and sunlight and allows the plants to grow and bloom. I went on to say that threshing the yard with the rake, removes all the dead grass and opens up the soil to make for better irrigation with the next rain or watering. Finally, putting out the patio furniture gives us a nice place to sit and enjoy some company. When we got home, we worked together and got all of the jobs done quickly and our yard looked beautiful!

Thinking about the yard work reminds me of my relationship with Jesus. Picking up the sticks and things is like picking up all the “junk” that clogs up my life and clearing it away so there is room in my heart and mind to let Jesus in. Raking the flower beds, is similar to how Jesus takes all of our worries and concerns away and prepares our hearts for His word and guidance so we can grow. Threshing the grass reminds me of Jesus removing our sins through forgiveness, which allows us to heal as He fills our soul. Finally, setting up the patio furniture to enjoy company is similar to setting time aside each day to enjoy the company of God. When I am faithful in my efforts to clean up my “spiritual” lawn, my life looks as beautiful as my yard does.

As we embrace Spring and get our yards, garages, houses, and everything else ready for Spring, let us be sure to also take time to prepare our hearts for Jesus.
