## An Update on Our Wisconsin Conference Apportionments

Congregations of Wisconsin Annual Conference in Christ: Apportionments are an opportunity for sharing God-showered resources with local, national and global missions, within our Connectional System. With gratitude to God and to the people of Wisconsin Conference, we are pleased to report that we have received better receipts in June than May results. We're now at 34.6% of apportionments received, which is just a little above last year and a little below our 5-year average. We thank every United Methodist, lay and clergy, and every local congregation, members and leaders, for your continued generous commitment to support the diverse ministries that continue to impact individuals and communities here and everywhere. What do apportionments do? The World Service Fund is one of the seven apportioned funds of The United Methodist Church. Basic to the financial program of The United Methodist Church, this vital fund helps to build new churches, prepare clergy and lay leaders, increase the number of young clergy and pay missionary salaries. It also helps to expand Bible studies, provide leadership for youth ministry, continue a proud tradition of cooperation and dialogue with other faith traditions through interdenominational and ecumenical work, and express the church's commitment to God's Kingdom of love through advocacy for peace and justice. Your continued generous participation in the apportionment payment helps the World Service Fund, which is the financial lifeline to a long list of Christian mission and ministry both in the USA and across the world. On July 28, 2015 Interfaith Food Pantry served 173 families, 695 individuals, 272 children (16 and under) and 52 seniors (65+).

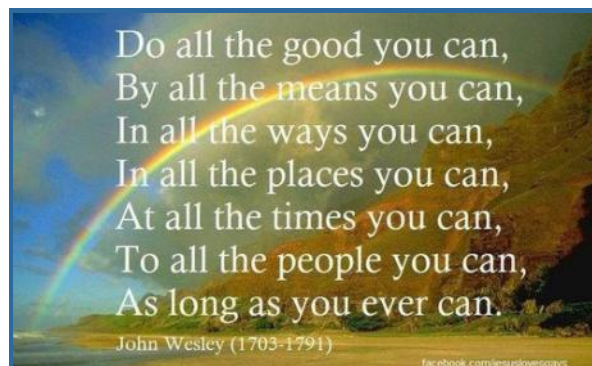

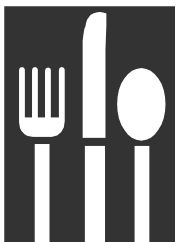

## A Stewardship Message

**#15-8 “I’m thankful for all of you every time I pray ... because of the way you have been my partners in the ministry of the gospel from the time you first believed it until now.” (Philippians 1:4-5, CEV)**

Thank you for your faithfulness in giving and worship attendance this summer. Your continued giving through your tithes and offerings has made it possible for us to pay our utilities and salaries and provide for persons in need. It means we have provided nursery care for our youngest disciples, summer Sunday School and Vacation Bible School classes and a youth mission trip experience. Families celebrating baptisms have been welcomed and families remembering the gifts of one who has died have been comforted.

Your giving also allows us to pay a portion of our mission giving. Our apportionments (or a-portion-meant-for-others) have put the systems in place so we could actually get pastors moved to serve new congregations throughout Wisconsin starting July 1st. They also put the systems in place to allow all of the health kits, flood buckets and other items brought to annual conference to be delivered to those in need. A total of 12,581 pounds was sent to the Midwest Mission Distribution Center following annual conference. About 1500 pounds was collected for Harbor House in Superior, about 300 pounds each for Northcott Neighborhood House and United Methodist Children’s Services in Milwaukee.

Our apportionments help provide the staff and facilities at Pine Lake Camp and Lake Lucerne Camp and Retreat Center. More than 725 campers have registered to date this summer, including: Super Hero Camp, Night Owl Camp, horse camps, canoe camps, family camps, grandparent/grandchild camps, adult Special Needs camps, the Stewardship Retreat and many more. All of our camps invite children, youth and adults to experience the love of Jesus Christ in new and different ways in the outdoors.

Our ministry is in our local community, our state, our nation and world-wide. Thank you for the gifts you continue to give to the ministry of Christ through our Church in the world.

#### **Apportionments**

As United Methodists, we call ourselves a “connectional” church. In other words, we are connected in our ministry and mission as a denomination. One of the ways we stay connected is our apportionment giving. As a congregation, we have a portion of the costs for ministry in Wisconsin and in the world beyond. Our portion is \$63,792 for 2015. This amount is NOT based on membership. These funds cover administrative costs of the conference/denomination, some costs around clergy, mission and ministry. We take great pride in being faithful to this commitment each year.
