

MEET OUR NEW FACILITIES TEAM


When we moved to our new leadership structure with our Accountable Leadership Board, we needed to have a group who would focus on keeping our buildings and grounds updated and ready for all our ministries. So, we have formed a Facilities Team. Our current members include: Carl Rasmussen, Roger Wurtzel, Len Hill, Jane Zierke, Janet Carter, and our

custodian, Dave Patterson. The responsibilities of this team are listed below. Please pray for the members of this team as they engage in this important ministry.

General Responsibilities:

1. To maintain the church properties in a clean, usable, safe condition.
2. To create a prioritized list of all facility improvement projects needed for all church properties.
3. To ensure that major appliances are operable.

4. To contract with outside contractors when repairs are beyond the scope of the Facility Team's ability, time commitment, or workload.
5. To inspect property and grounds periodically to see what needs attention.
6. To make recommendations to the Accountable Leadership Board concerning capital maintenance needs, as appropriate.
7. To make repairs to the parsonage as needed.
8. To lead out in ways to involve church members in low-profile maintenance projects, such as cleaning storage rooms, spring cleaning, maintaining church grounds (weeding, trimming, spreading mulch), etc.
9. Ensure that all buildings are ready for church-related activities and that they are properly secured when services are not occurring.

REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT TEAM UPDATE

Our Refugee Resettlement Team, which is a combined team of our congregation with Good Shepherd Lutheran, Trinity Lutheran, and Holy Spirit Catholic churches, has been very busy over the past few weeks.

Currently, we are organizing for our next family to arrive, the Almsalmeh family from Syria. This is a family of ten, with eight children ranging in age from a year old to 21 years old. They should arrive in our area around August 10. We have a home close by the church for them to move into and we will be working to get it ready for them. Along with their home, our team will be helping them in several other areas like getting the kids enrolled in the school system, getting them connected to our health care system, helping them set up bank accounts, and assisting them with transportation to their various appointments. Also, we will be arranging for

them to go through the cultural orientation seminars, dealing with language and customs, organized by the Portage County Literacy Council who is using our building to hold these classes.

As of now, five other resettlement teams in our community are working with families or individuals from other countries. Our resource room at our church in rooms D/E in the Discovery Zone is active and being used weekly as more families arrive.

This has been an amazing ministry of extending the hospitality, grace, and light of God's love and hope to those most in need. If you would like to support this ministry please talk with me or Mary Schultz.

ONE BIG TENT

**"Connecting the church to the community
through the love of God"**

One Big Tent, our joint ministry of area congregations reaching out to our neighbors in need, continues to grow as we are helping more people out of our offices (1039b B Ellis St.) in downtown Stevens Point.

One of the neighbors we helped recently came in because she had lost her job, was behind on her rent, and she needed food for her and her three kids. Like the majority of our neighbors who we help, they are often just one paycheck away from homelessness. We were able to get her an emergency food box from the Interfaith Food Pantry as well as give her a list of other food pantries and food resources for her and her children. Connecting her with Operation Bootstrap we helped her with part of her rent and we also connected her to some job development resources. However, the main thing we did was listen and provide a compassionate safe place as we walked with her through her crisis of worry and fear about her future for her and her family.

This neighbor's story is unfortunately not unique in our community. There are so many people struggling around us and the power of this ministry is that all it takes to help them is to

have an open heart and a willingness to listen. This is why this ministry exists so that we can build relationships with those who come for help as we listen to their stories and walk with them in their need. We also work hard to connect them with local non-profit agencies and community resources/information that already exist to support people when they are struggling. However, when no one can help then we are the safety net to keep people from crisis situations like homelessness.

I would like to ask for your continued support of this important ministry in our community in the following ways.

- 1) Please pray for those in need as we work with them and for the companions and clergy who give their time to help find solutions.
- 2) Prayerfully consider if you would like to be a companion talking with and working with our neighbors who need help. We offer training and only ask people to volunteer for a 3-4 hour shift once a week. Also, we pair you with a clergy person who is there to support you. For example, I (Pastor Tim) volunteer every Wednesday with a member from Beloved Community from 8:00 a.m. to Noon. If you are interested, please talk with Pastor Tim
- 3) When it is appropriate, we do provide financial support to help with rent assistance, car repair, buying medicines, etc. We work with people to identify what they can contribute and we make up the difference with what they owe. We could use your financial support to help us meet these ongoing needs. If you would like to make a financial contribution, please make the check out to our church and put, "One Big Tent" in the memo line.

Thank you for your prayerful and generous support of this important ministry to make God's love real to all our neighbors.
